### **BLACK HILLS EMPLOYEES ENCOURAGE HOME WEATHERIZATION**

*Weatherization program teaches homeowners about simple, low- and no-cost measures that can help save on energy costs*

WEST DES MOINES, Iowa, Dec. 15, 2009 – Whether it is very cold or hot weather, it generally means higher utility bills, and Black Hills Corp.’s companywide weatherization program is showing homeowners that spending a few dollars and a weekend afternoon can lead to year-round energy savings. This fall, Black Hills employees, along with some community volunteers, partnered to weatherize 116 homes in six states.

“Using energy wisely is top of mind for most homeowners during any season,” said Tracy Peterson, vice president of Iowa Gas for Black Hills Energy. “Our weatherization program teaches customers that there are simple ways to reduce energy consumption, lower utility bills and still stay comfortable indoors.”

As an ongoing tradition, Black Hills employees provide weatherization services at no charge to selected homeowners in preparation for the winter heating season. In cooperation with local energy assistance agencies, homeowners are chosen who, due to financial, age or health limitations, are unable to weatherize their homes themselves.

“Weatherizing homes is part of our larger outreach effort to teach customers about the benefits of energy efficiency measures,” Peterson said. “Being energy efficient provides benefits year-round. Customers can save money and use less energy without having to sacrifice comfort. For those reasons, no matter the season, we encourage customers to make the simple changes that can help them reap the benefits throughout the year.”

Homes chosen for the weatherization program by local non-profit organizations are first inspected by Black Hills professionals to determine what might be needed. Then, Black Hills volunteer weatherization teams undertake measures that might include weather-stripping, caulking, pressurized expanding foam, window plastic, outlet gaskets, a water heater blanket and water heater pipe insulation.

Six homes were weatherized by Black Hills Energy Teams in the company’s Iowa natural gas service territory. And by collaborating with local organizations and businesses, Black Hills Energy is able to weatherize more homes. This year, Black Hills Energy partnered with local Iowa

groups to weatherize approximately 130 homes in Dubuque, 30 homes in Maquoketa and 20 homes in Cresco.

And in Iowa, rebate programs are available beginning with a free home energy audit. The rebates can help pay for insulation and energy efficient doors, appliances and furnaces. More information is at [www.BHEHowTo.com](http://www.BHEHowTo.com) or by calling 888-567-0799.
